Incidents of Note.

1/1/22 – Front and Rear number plates were stolen from a vehicle in Ratling Road.

6/1/22 - Migrants found in the back of a lorry on Aylesham industrial estate, both males arrested for entering by deception.

6/1/22 – Adisham Rd, RTC Non-Injury,

9/1/22 – Ackholt Single Vehicle RTC, no injury. Slipped on the ice.

11/1/22 – Market Square, Burglary on the sweet shop. This happened while the owner was away. A 'shop closed until...' post was put on FB unfortunately this does advertise to criminals it will be unattended. Untidy search minimal cash taken.

11/1/22 – Youths on the trains station, we have had a few reports about this, they are smoking weed, have been abusive to BTP. Engagement from PCSO, they were moved on, they claim they sit there as there is nowhere else to sit.

13/1/22 – Central Boulevard, suspicious males. Officers were attending another call. When they came out of the property 2x males all dressed in dark clothing turned and ran in the opposite direction, officer gave chase but lost them down the Gittys.

13/1/22 – Attlee Ave, A child was riding his Scooter in the road. An off-road motorbike came round the corner colliding with the scooter. The rider came off the bike. No injury to either party. No details for the motor bike rider.

18/1/22 – Attlee Ave, reports of a homeless person sleeping in a shed, trainers, blanket, tea lights and food wrappers were in there, the informant was told to lock the shed. No more reports.

23/1/22 – Blue Flame Rd, parking obstruction. We are starting to see an increase with parking complaints in the new builds. House holds are getting more and more vehicles and there isn't enough street parking.

24/1/22 – a small group of youths seem to be causing issues mainly around the new builds, people have taken to FB to report this. A couple have been spoken to about their behaviour but need more names. Calls are not coming into 101.

24/1/22 – An 11-year-old was assaulted by another child of the same age. Crime report has been created. We have received a lot of calls of the similar nature. Children are taking bullying to the next level now.

26/1/22 – Bullying between 2 11-year-olds, the parent has then threatened one of the lads if it continues.

The Group of Shoplifters that kept targeting the co-op we not local and were committing these crimes all over the county. The media appeal released by Kent Police was successful and we received names for these criminals. They will be dealt with accordingly!!



Stay safe online

Switch on the encryption within your wi-fi software so that no one can use your internet connection without your password.

Remember that not everyone you meet online will be who they say they are.

•

Use a good firewall when you are on the internet to prevent others from accessing personal data without your permission.

•

Don't give out personal details that reveal your identity or where you live to someone you meet online.

•

Don't reply to emails asking for bank account and credit card details – genuine companies will not ask you to confirm personal information via email as it is not secure.

•

Don't arrange to meet people you don't know. However, if you do agree to meet someone you have chatted to online, tell someone where and when you are meeting or take someone with you. Always meet in a public place.
