Community focus: Please allow me to introduce myself as your ward Constable. My name is PC Jon Bowler. I have been a Constable for over 23 years working in both the Metropolitan and Kent Police. Up until October 2023, my entire Police Service was spent on front line response policing responding to emergency 999 calls as well as proactively policing my area and looking for offenders. I am now part of Dover Community Safety Unit Neighbourhood Team where I have been allocated Beat Areas to patrol and engage with the communities directly.

In the past few weeks, I have been out walking around the parish wards. I have been allocated the Aylesham, Eastry & Little Stour wards including all the surrounding villages. This is obviously a vast area, but I have already been out to most villages speaking to locals and overall, it has been very positive.

I will endeavour to serve you all to the best of my ability and with the help of our hard-working PCSO colleagues we will be as visible in the community as we can be.

I would urge any readers to sign up to My Community Voice. This is an excellent two-way communication platform that also has the capacity to link users to our partner agencies. This broadens our combined reach and the information available to you.

I will try to arrange a surgery in the parish in the coming weeks and attend as many Parish Council meetings as possible. I will send details of any such appointments in due course. Anti-social behaviour and other incidents of note.

Nuisance vehicles are a constant focus not just on the roads with the car meets that are being arranged, but by those attending local areas and riding off road motorbikes. We have had a recent influx of fraudulent telephone calls whereby the callers are impersonating police officers. They are suggesting that they may have someone held in custody for using the victims bank card and request money to be sent to confirm this.

Please be aware that if one of our officers do make contact with you via phone they will clearly identify themselves often with their name and or force number. To confirm an officers identity you can call 101 and give the force number of the officer for confirmation from the force control room.

Officers will never;

Ask you for your bank details or PIN

Ask you to transfer any funds to another account

Ask you to hand over cash or bank cards to a courier

Ask you to pay a fine or a fee to them or a third party over the phone or online

Ask you for access to your computer, passwords or log on details over the phone or online

Ask you to register personal details in an attachment or website online

Ask you to assist in an investigation by doing any of the above

State that you are committing a crime by not complying

Communicate in an abusive, threatening or coercive manner
