

## PCSO Report for April &amp; May 2022

For awareness of residents, there have been a few reports of a female attending addresses in the area of Nonington asking for help. She has used excuses of fleeing Domestic abuse, running out of fuel and flat phone battery. Fortunately, people have sent her on her way. The ladies at the church did hand over 15 pounds as she was claiming she was fleeing Domestic Abuse. Please be vigilant and share locally.

Op Feilding was carried out over the weekend of the 23<sup>rd</sup> of April, we didn't receive any calls for bikes in that weekend, all the hotspot areas were checked. 1 Vehicle was seized for no insurance.

The Callum Wheeler court case has been prevalent in the village. People have remained very respectful which has helped the family through another tough time. Sadly, we had the disrespectful act carried out with the removal of Julia's plaque. We believe this was aimed more at police due to a note that was left in its place. The resident who made the plaque has kindly made a new as I'm sure everyone has seen. The support from the community has been nothing but heart felt. The investigation into the theft of the plaque is still open, should anyone see or hear anything then it should be reported to 101.

We are seeing increased numbers of Dog-on-Dog attacks and Dog bites. We don't really know if this is due to the increase in dogs purchased over lockdown and now people don't have the time to train them or just one of those things. Puppy classes in Aylesham is probably the one thing it doesn't offer.

The dog warden and I do carry out visits to reports of Dog on Dog to educate the responsibility of being a Dog owner.

**Calls over the last month.**

**01/04/22** - Anonymous call, the informant reported The Premier store on the Market Square are supplying alcohol to a friend when they have been requested not to. They then stated the store is serving underage.

**03/04/22** - Hobnail Path, 1 boy 2 girls aged around 11-13 smoking Cannabis or Cigarettes. Police Attended area search no trace.

**04/04/22** – Queens Road, Child bitten by family dog. Superficial facial injury to the lip, internal and external reported by the hospital.

**04/04/22** – Burgess Road, informant sold a phone on FB, the buyer collected appeared to transfer the funds. When informant checked later the funds were not there. (hard lesson learnt).

**05/04/22** – Dorman Ave North, Youths entering the flats communal area, smoking and distinguishing on the carpets. Damaged door reported to housing by residents. No reply from housing to police yet.

**08/04/22** – Cornwallis Avenue - 999 call from phone box. Female heard to say 'Hello' nothing more. Possibly children. Area search no trace.

**09/04/22** – Rogers Close 12:35 hours, a male was seen hanging around outside houses. A resident shouted out the window and the male ran away. The male returned, officers attended and took details of the male.

**11/04/22** – Skate Park an 8-year-old informant reported there was going to be a fight at the skate park. This was pre-arranged; he was saying his older brother was going to be involved. Other teenagers were attending with weapons and knives. Further investigation showed this to be a hoax call.

**13/04/22** – Queens Road, Doctors surgery, Youths on the roof, running across the flat roof taking pictures of one another.

**13/04/22** – Dorman Ave North junction with Central Boulevard. RTC Non injury. Officers attended to assist with exchange of details.

**13/04/22** – Queens Road Flats, youths entering the communal area of flats. Door reported to Housing.

**15/04/22** – Ackholt Road, Drunk male lying asleep in the bushes, Secam attended.

**15/04/22** – Cooting Road onto Hill Crescent report of drunk driving, vehicle bouncing of kerbs etc, very bad driving. Nominated for ANPR.

**17/04/22** – Beresford Grove, Shed fire. Believed to be suspicious ignition. KFRS attended.

**21/04/22** – Millyard Road, Motorbike stolen off the drive. Theft caught on the ring doorbell.

**23/04/22** – Coniston Drive, ongoing damage to vehicle. Likely to be parking issues.

**24/04/22** – Queens Road, youths causing issues at the flats again.

**26/04/22** – Kings Road, RTC intoxicated male knocked off pedal cycle, SECAM attended. Male taken to hospital. Dislocated shoulder.

**28/04/22** – Adisham Road RTC lorry vs pedestrian. Believed to be suicide.

## **MAY**

**01/05/22** – Kings Road, Theft of caravan, a dark silver van (no Reg gained) drove round noticed the caravan was insecure, hooked it up and drove off. Neighbours assumed they had permission to take it.

**01/05/22** – Aylesham train station, Suicide risk. Male on tracks. Police attended male was referred to relevant agencies.

**01/05/22** – Rattling Road, Member of the public was walking along with his partner when he was approached and threaten with a knife. The male then Threatened other at the Ratling Social Club. A name has been given and a crime report created.

**08/05/22** – Cornwallis Ave, Drug driving. Male seen smoking whilst driving. Strong smell of Cannabis. Vehicle Nominated for ANPR.

**10/05/22** – Market Place, Group of girls seen setting a fire on the picnic bench. Charred marks left on the bench.

**12/05/22** – Hill Crescent, Male spotted in the garden, possibly going to break into the shed. Male was challenged and left. CCTV caught the male. No ID for him yet.

**15/05/22** - Cripps Close, vehicles using the car park at the end to meet and use/deal drugs. Only one report since last year. Patrols to pay attention.

**16/05/22** – Queens Road, Informant reported waking up to someone picking his door lock. The sensor lights came on. Nobody seen. Extensive area search by police. Nothing found.

**18/05/22** - B2046 Dog found running in the road. Members of the public held the dog. It was a lurcher type dog. Informant was directed to the dog warden.

**19/05/22** – Co-op Market Place, Informant reported leaving his card in the cash point, the card was then used to make purchases in store, Theft of bank card crime report has been created.

**20/05/22** – Central Boulevard, Stolen motorbike. CCTV footage caught the theft. Enquiries ongoing.
